Spirit-Led Follower: What role does Scripture play in guiding your life?

Text

Have someone read aloud Revelation 20:11-15.

The passage highlights the Great White Throne Judgment, urging us to consider how our lives reflect our relationship with Jesus. As we read about the final judgment, let's focus on practical ways we can live out our faith authentically, ensuring our works align with our professed beliefs. Today, we aim to cultivate a deeper, personal relationship with Jesus, one that goes beyond knowledge to genuine connection and trust.

Discussion Questions

1. If you could have a book written about your life, what would you want it to say? What parts would you prefer to leave out?

Have someone read aloud 2 Corinthians 5:10.

2. What does it mean that Christians are judged by their actions but not saved by their actions?

Have someone read aloud Matthew 7:21-23.

- 3. What's the difference between knowing about Jesus and truly knowing Him? How can we ensure we're in the latter category?
- 4. How does the concept of a final judgment challenge or affirm your current understanding of God?



Application

- 1. How does the idea of God recording every aspect of our lives make you feel? Does it bring comfort, anxiety, or both?
- 2. How do you think our motivations impact how God views our actions?
- 3. What do you think it means to progress rather than achieve perfection in the Christian life?
- 4. Consider someone in your life who may only know about Jesus. How can you help them move toward knowing Him personally?

Prayer

At the end of your conversation, spend some time praying as a group. Here is a prompt:

1. Lead the group in a prayer of thanksgiving for God's grace and the security found in a genuine relationship with Jesus. Ask for wisdom and strength to live lives that reflect true faith and trust in Him.
