EXPLAIN How does the parable of the persistent widow challenge or encourage your view of prayer?

APPLY The three areas to examine if prayers seem unanswered are: faults, faith, and frequency. Which of these areas do you find most challenging in your prayer life? Why?

Questions for Families

Here are some questions you can discuss with the whole family.

What do you think this Scripture shows us about God and how He listens to us?

Guide younger children by discussing how God is always listening and wants to help us. For older kids, explore the idea of God being much more caring than the unjust judge and how He responds out of love.

How do you think the widow felt when she kept asking the judge for help? Do you think we can feel the same way sometimes when we pray?

With younger children, use examples of times they've had to keep asking for something. Encourage older children to share personal experiences where persistence was important, and discuss feelings of patience or frustration.

What can we learn from this Scripture about how we should pray or talk to God?

Help younger children see that they can talk to God anytime and should keep praying no matter what. For older children, discuss the importance of consistency and faith in prayer, even if answers aren't immediate.



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
