### Introduction

Have someone read aloud Matthew 2:1-3.

What defines the Herodian kingdom or kingdom of this world, and what defines the Kingdom of God?

How do you see elements of each of these kingdoms in the way we celebrate Christmas?

Have someone read aloud Philippians 2:5-11, James 4:6.

Why does God oppose the proud?

What promises does God give to the humble throughout Scripture?

Take time to apply what you have discussed to yourself and the Bible.
