### “Easter Eggs” in the Genealogy of Matthew

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Hunting for easter eggs as a child was always exciting because you never knew where the eggs were or what the eggs contained. Today on the podcast we'll examine a few more of these hidden “easter eggs” from Matthew's genealogy.

#### **Introduction**

**Recap:** Last week on the Forgotten Jesus Podcast we talked about the Jeconiah problem. Pastor Robby discussed the importance of Old Testament prophecies and the point Matthew was trying to make when he included Jeconiah in the genealogy.

Take a few minutes to review this week's episode and what stuck out to everyone from the episode.

**How can sitting with the Word of God and meditating on it impact what you get from your Bible study rather than just reading?**

#### **Discussion**

Have someone read aloud **Matthew 1:1-10**.

**What are some connections you see between the genealogy and the TaNaK (Old Testament)?**

**How do the footnotes help us see connections with the scripture we are reading and other parts of the Bible?**

**How do cross-references and connections impact how you read scripture?**



## **Application**

Have someone read aloud **Matthew 17:1-8** and **Luke 9:28-36**.

**How do we see the themes of Matthew's Gospel highlighted in the transfiguration?**

**Are there other passages from the Gospels that stand out to you for their connections to the Old Testament?**

**How do these connections between the Old and New Testament impact your faith and study of the Bible?**

## **Pray**

At the end of your conversation, spend some time praying as a group. Here is a prompt:

**Pray that the Lord increases our desire to meditate on His Word, and through that, He would reveal more of Himself to us.**
