Join us today as we continue to look at the birth narrative from Luke 2 and meet a man named Simeon. Introduction **Recap:** Last week on *The Forgotten Jesus Podcast*, we talked about Jesus' family fleeing to Egypt and what it looks like to lament during difficult times. Take a few minutes to discuss this week's episode and what stuck out to everyone. Is there a time you have had to wait way longer than you thought for a promise to be fulfilled? What was that wait like? Discussion Have someone read aloud Luke 2:25-33. Why do you think God made Simeon that promise? When Simeon finally saw Jesus, why do you think he quoted nine different Scriptures? Have someone read aloud Isaiah 40:1-5 and Isaiah 40:28-31. How is the Jewish idea of trust (Qavah) similar or different from the modern definition of trust? What similarities are there between Simeon and the Jews who were the audience of Isaiah? How do we see these Scriptures fulfilled according to Simeon and the **New Testament?**

Take some time to apply what you have discussed.

How in tune do you feel with the Holy Spirit?

How can we miss out on the blessings of God when we are not in tune with the Holy Spirit?

What do you need to add or remove in your life to help you be more in tune with the workings of the Holy Spirit?

What has you weary or burdened right now? At the end of your prayer time, read Matthew 11:28-30 over your group.
