### Healing A Man Born Blind: The Third Messianic Miracle

Today, we will look at the third and final messianic miracle, healing a man who was born blind.

### **Introduction**

**Recap:** Last week on *The Forgotten Jesus Podcast*, we discussed the major shift in Jesus' ministry and why He taught in parables.

Take a few minutes to discuss this week's episode and what stuck out to everyone.

### **Discussion**

*Have someone read aloud [John 9:1-25](#)*

1. Based on Scripture, what are some reasons people can be struck with sickness or suffering?

*Have someone read aloud [Exodus 34:7](#)*

2. How do we see the misapplication of the Torah shaping Jewish theology and their understanding of sickness and sin?
3. How do we see people's misinterpretation or misapplication of the Bible today lead to confusion and bad theology?
4. What lessons can we learn from Jesus healing this blind man?

*Have someone read aloud [Genesis 2:7](#)*

5. Why do you think Jesus used mud and the pool of Siloam in this miracle?



## **Application:**

Take some time to apply what you have discussed.

1. How does our own salvation mirror the miracle of Jesus healing the man born blind?
2. How does the testimony of the blind man communicate who Jesus is? What do you think your testimony communicates about Jesus?
3. How can you utilize the testimony God has given you this week to share the Gospel and glorify God?

## **Pray**

Share prayer requests and pray as a group at the end of your conversation.

Here are some prompts:

1. Who is someone you know who is spiritually blind? Pray that the Lord will open that person's eyes.
2. Pray that the Lord would help us faithfully interpret and apply His Word to our own lives.
