Introduction

Discussion

Have someone read aloud Luke 3:7-14 and Matthew 3:3-6

- 1. How does the act of baptism develop from the Jewish Mikvah, John the Baptist's baptism, and the baptism that Jesus taught?
- 2. How have we seen differences in the mode and timing of baptism develop in the modern church, and how does the Bible help guide us in these decisions?
- 3. Why do you think baptism is one of the first steps of obedience given to people when they repent and accept Christ?
- 4. How would you describe baptism and its purpose to an unbeliever?



Application:

Take some time to apply what you have discussed.

- 1. If you have been baptized, what prompted your decision to be baptized, and how has it affected you and others?
- What is the next step of obedience you feel like the Lord is calling you to take? (If that is baptism, you can find more information below under <u>The</u> <u>Forgotten Jesus Resources</u>)
