Studying the Word Under a Fig Tree

John 1:47-51

Discussion Questions

- 1. Read John 1:47-49. What stands out about Jesus' first words to Nathanael? Why do you think Jesus focused on Nathanael's character?
- 2. Nathanael's skepticism is evident in John 1:46. How does "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" reflect cultural and personal biases?
- 3. What does Jesus mean by saying, "I saw you under the fig tree"? Why is this significant to Nathanael?
- 4. How are fig trees symbolic in Jewish culture, and what can this teach us about studying God's Word?
- 5. Discuss the connection between Jacob's dream in Genesis 28:12-13 and Jesus' words in John 1:51. How does Jesus fulfill the imagery of the stairway to heaven?
- 6. What does Nathanael's declaration in John 1:49 ("You are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel") tell us about his realization of who Jesus is?
- 7. How does Jesus contrast with cultural expectations of a Messiah or religious leader, particularly as a rabbi from Nazareth?
- 8. How does Jesus redefine the "dwelling" or "tabernacling" of God's presence through His incarnation (John 1:14)?
- 9. Why do you think Nathanael's encounter with Jesus revolved around his private spiritual moments under the fig tree? What does this teach about personal devotion?
- 10. How does Nathanael's story encourage us to approach Jesus with our questions and doubts?

Application Questions

- 1. How do you approach studying God's Word? Are there ways to deepen your practice, like "sitting under the fig tree" in contemplation?
- 2. In what ways do cultural or personal biases shape your expectations of God's work in your life? How can you overcome them?
- 3. Jesus recognized Nathanael's heart. What would Jesus say about your character today?
- 4. Nathanael moved from skepticism to belief. Can you recall a moment in your life when an encounter with Jesus changed your perspective?
- 5. How can you make space for uninterrupted time with God this week to meditate on His Word?
- 6. The idea of angels ascending and descending speaks of connection between heaven and earth through Jesus. How does this reality influence your view of prayer and worship?
- 7. How can you respond when you encounter skepticism about Jesus, as Philip did with Nathanael?
- 8. What can you do this week to recognize and respond to Jesus' presence in your everyday life?
- 9. Are there "Nazareths" in your life—places or people you doubt God could use? How might you adjust your view?
- 10. In what ways can your personal devotion and study impact the community around you?

Prayer Prompt

• Spend time in prayer thanking Jesus for being the bridge between heaven and earth. Ask Him to give you a heart like Nathanael's, free from deceit, and a hunger for His Word. Pray for deeper personal encounters with Him this week and for wisdom to help others "come and see" His goodness.
